# Spiritual Gifts

Please read each of the following summaries of the spiritual gifts talked about in scripture. While doing that think if you might have that gift.

**Administration:** Organizing and helping others become more efficient in reaching their ministry goals. People with this spiritual gift...

- Effectively organize people to reach their ministry goals.
- Usually have specific plans to reach clearly defined goals.
- Get other people involved, making it possible to accomplish more.
- Enjoy making decisions.
- Understand what needs to be done for dreams to become a reality.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(*Luke 14:28-30, Acts 6:1-7, 1 Corinthians 12:28*)

**Apostleship:** Launching and leading new ministries that advance God's purposes and expand his kingdom. The original Greek meaning of the word apostle is "sent one" (literally, one sent with authority, or as an ambassador). People with this spiritual gift...

- Are eager to start new ministries for God.
- Often welcome risky new challenges.
- Enjoy making a difference in the lives of both believers and unbelievers.
- Want to be known as representatives of Jesus in their culture.
- Willingly work hard to see ministries reach their full potential for God.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(*Acts 15:22-35, 1 Cor. 12:28, 2 Cor. 12:12, Galatians 2:7-10, Ephesians 4:11-14*)

**Discernment:** Recognizing truth or error within a message, person, or event. People with this spiritual gift...

- Find it easy to "read" others, and are often right.
- Recognize the spiritual source of a message—whether it is from God, from Satan, or human.
- Recognize inconsistencies in other.
- Easily identify people's true motives and agendas.

- Know when the truth is twisted or communicated with error.

*(Matthew 16:21-23, Acts 5:1-11, Acts 16:16-18, 1 Cor. 12:10, 1 John 4:1-6)*

***Encouragement:*** Helping others live God-centered lives through inspiration, encouragement, counseling, and motivation. People with this spiritual gift...

- Want to inspire others to become more like Jesus.
- Rejoice with people who have overcome tough times
- Seek opportunities to help others reach their full potential as followers of Jesus.
- Find ways to encourage through words or actions.
- Celebrate when friends succeed.

*I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No*  
 (

***Evangelism:*** Sharing the love of Jesus with others in a way that draws them toward a personal relationship with God. People with this spiritual gift...

- Look for ways to build friendships with nonbelievers.
- Sense when a person is open to the message of good news.
- Have likely seen friends come to faith in Jesus.
- Help bring others to Christ through acts of love.
- Deeply care for friends and strangers who don't know Jesus.

**I think, I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8, Ephesians 4:11-14)*

***Faith:*** Stepping out in faith to see God's purposes accomplished, trusting him to handle obstacles along the way. People with this spiritual gift...

- Welcome risk for God.
- Enjoy unpredictable situations.
- Are challenged by ideas others say are impossible.
- Often have a passionate prayer life.
- Have great God-confidence in their efforts.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one); Yes Maybe No**  
*(Acts 11:22-24, Romans 4:18-21, 1 Cor. 12:9, Hebrews 11)*

***Giving:*** Joyfully supporting and funding various God-honoring efforts through financial contributions beyond the tithe. People with this spiritual gift...

- Plan and purposely give more than the tithe (10 percent) to see God's kingdom advanced
- Generally prefer their donations remain anonymous or low-profile.
- Strategically seek ways to increase their resources so they can give more for God's use.
- See their resources as tools for God's use.
- Recognize God's ultimate ownership of everything (including their money).

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(Mark 12:41-44, Romans 12:8, 2 Cor 8:1-7, 9:2-7)

***Healing:*** Restoring to health or healing, beyond traditional and natural means, those who are sick, hurting, and suffering. People with this spiritual gift...

- Believe firmly that people can be supernaturally healed.
- Pray specifically to be used by God to heal others.
- Fully realize that healing occurs only by God's permission.
- View medicine as a means God may choose for healing.
- Embrace their gift as from the hand of God, and as a specific way to bring Him glory.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(Acts 3:1-10, 9:32-35, 28:7-10, 1 Cor 12:9 and 28)

***Helping:*** Offering others assistance. This is sometimes referred to as the spiritual gift of "helps" or "service." People with this spiritual gift...

- Enjoy and seek ways to serve behind the scenes.
- Look for ways to help friends succeed.
- Are often focused on details.
- Look for ways to assist others in need.
- Do not seek recognition for their efforts.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(Mark 15:40-41, Acts 9:36, Romans 16:1-2, 1 Cor. 12:28)

***Hospitality:*** Providing others with a warm and welcoming environment and meeting some of their basic needs. People with this spiritual gift...

- Make other people feel valued and cared for.
- Look for peers who may go unnoticed in a crowd.
- Want people to feel loved and welcomed.
- View their home as God's property, given to them expressly to make others feel welcome.
- Promote deep friendships wherever they are.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Acts 16:14-15, Romans 12:13, 16:23, Hebrews 13:1-2, 1 Peter 4:9)*

***Interpretation:*** Understanding, at a specific time, God's message when spoken by another person who is using a special language (tongues) unknown to the others in attendance. People with this spiritual gift tend to...

- Have a clear idea of what God is saying, even though the language used by the speaker is unknown to them at the specific time.
- Be able to translate words and messages of God in a way that builds up, comforts, and challenges believers.
- Communicate the meaning of sounds words, and utterances that glorify God, made by others.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Acts 2:1-13, 1 Cor. 12:10, 14:1-14)*

***Knowledge:*** Communicating God's truth to others in a way that promotes justice, honest, and understanding. People with this spiritual gift...

- Devote lots of time to reading and studying the Bible.
- Love to share biblical insight.
- Enjoy helping others understand the Bible better.
- Benefit from time invested studying and researching scripture.
- Take delight in answering tough questions about God's Word.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Acts 5:1-11, 1 Cor. 12:8, Colossians 2:2-3)*

***Leadership:*** Casting vision, stimulating spiritual growth, applying strategies, and leading others to achieve results. People with his spiritual gift...

- Usually have "big ideas" for God and the ability to rally other people to accomplish those ideas.
- Are naturally drawn toward leadership roles.

- Find it easy to motivate people—both individually and in teams—to work together in achieving goals for God.
- Naturally grasp the “big picture.”
- Willingly give responsibilities and tasks to other people.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Romans 12:8, 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17, Hebrews 13:17)*

***Mercy:*** Ministering to those who suffer physically, emotionally, spiritually, or relationally. Their actions are characterized by love, care, compassion, and kindness toward others. People with this spiritual gift...

- Gravitate toward opportunities to practically help others in need.
- Devote significant time in prayer for those who are hurting.
- Tend to place the needs of others ahead of their own.
- Genuinely feel other people’s pain and suffering.
- Find fulfillment when visiting people in need—in hospitals, nursing homes, prisons, orphanages, villages, or wherever God directs them.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Matthew 9:35-36, Mark 9:41, Romans 12:8, 1 Thess. 5:14)*

***Miracles:*** Being used through supernatural acts that point to God and his power. People with this spiritual gift...

- Recognize prayer as a supernatural vehicle through which God acts in the lives of people on earth.
- Give credit and thanks to God alone for supernatural works.
- Realize miracles only occur when God wills them to happen.
- See themselves as instruments for God’s use.
- Pray and look for supernatural results whenever they encounter impossible life situations.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
*(Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12, Romans 15:18-19, 1 Cor. 12:10 and 28)*

***Pastoring:*** Taking spiritual responsibility for a group of believers and helping them live lives directed by God’s Word. “Shepherding” is another word used for this

God's Word. "Shepherding" is another word used for this gift. People with this spiritual gift...

- Want to help others reach their full potential as followers of Christ.
- Enjoy serving others and look for opportunities to do this.
- Are good at developing personal, trust-based relationships with a small group of people.
- Are drawn toward meeting the needs of others, willingly giving time to help them with spiritual issues.
- Believe that people are more important than projects.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(John 10:1-18, Ephesians 4:11-14, 1 Timothy 3:1-7, 1 Peter 5:1-3)

**Prophecy:** Offering messages from God that comfort, encourage, guide, warn, or reveal sin in a way that leads to one's repentance and spiritual growth. The original Greek meaning of this word is "to speak forth the truth." The gift of prophecy includes both "forth telling" (preaching), and "foretelling" (revelation). People with this spiritual gift...

- Are known for publicly communicating God's Word, using a variety of means.
- Love to share strong biblical ideas with others.
- View themselves as God's tool, ready to be used by the Holy Spirit in changing lives.
- Find it easy to confront others' motives when they are not up to God's standards.
- Frequently receive and share messages directly from God for comforting, challenging, and confronting his people.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29, 1 Cor. 14:1-4, 1 Thess. 1:5)

**Teaching:** Presenting good Bible teaching in relevant ways, helping people gain a strong and mature spiritual education. People with this spiritual gift...

- Study Scripture intensely so they can help others apply its principles and truth.
- Enjoy making the Bible clear and understandable to friends.
- See how biblical principles remain relevant to today's culture.
- Are good at helping others learn to study the Bible.
- Recognize a variety of ways to effectively communicate the Word of God, including speaking.

**I think I may have this gift (circle one): Yes Maybe No**  
(Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21, 1 Cor. 12:28, Ephesians 4:11-14)

**Tongues:** Communicating God's message in a special language unknown to the speaker. (Not Prayer Language) People with this spiritual gift tend to...

- Believe God is prompting them to communicate this message, often through prayer, in a specific language unknown to them.
- Intercede for others in prayer using unknown words, sounds, and utterances.
- Desire opportunities to pray, using these unknown languages for God's Glory.

**Wisdom:** Making wise decisions and counseling others with solid advice, all in accordance with God's will. People with this spiritual gift...

- Have friends who come to them for advice or wisdom.
- Enjoy counseling others.
- Are known for making correct decisions and judgments.
- Recognize God as the primary source of wisdom and direction.

# Personality

As we start I want to encourage you that there is no “right” or “wrong” personalities for being used by God. The church needs and requires many different personalities to be most effective. God did not create you to please others or others to please you, but he created you to please him. When you understand the personality God has given you, you’ll do a better job of combining it with your spiritual gifts, heart, and abilities in service for God.

Here are two important questions to think about in answering the following questions about your personality.

1. How do you typically relate to other people?
2. How do you respond to opportunities?

Below I would like you to circle the number of the question that best describe you.

## ARE YOU MORE...

### Outgoing or Reserved?

Someone who is “outgoing” feels comfortable and actually prefers being around larger groups of people and tends to be energized in those settings. On the other hand, a “reserved” person prefers interacting with just a few people at a time and is satisfied and energized by a deep conversation with one friend. This person gets renewed through quiet, reflective times away from others.

*I tend to...*

1. Find ways to be part of the crowd.
2. Build deep relationships with a few friends, not large numbers of people.
3. Start conversations with people I don’t know.
4. Avoid being part of a large group.

### Self-Expressive or Self-Controlled?

“Self-expressive” people openly share thoughts and opinions with other people—they are able to easily express themselves. People who are more “self-controlled” tend to be less verbal about thoughts and opinions, at least until they get to know other people better.

*I tend to...*

1. Feel free to share my feelings with people I've just met.
2. Withhold my thoughts and feelings from others at certain times.
3. Seek opportunities to share my life with others.
4. Hold back so only a few close friends can truly know me.

### **Cooperative or Competitive?**

If you avoid conflict in your friendships and try to live peacefully with everyone, then you'd probably fit into the "cooperative" category. You also might accept other people's opinions without a lot of arguing. But if you enjoy overcoming obstacles and confronting new challenges, it's likely you have a more "competitive" personality. You may know kids at school who don't have a competitive bone in their body and others who want to compete with everything. ("I bet you I can get my locker open before you.") What about you?

*I tend to...*

1. Focus on making sure people feel comfortable when I'm around them.
2. Find importance in achievements.
3. Look for ways to make others content.
3. Embrace conflict and enjoy winning.

### **High Risk or Low Risk?**

I know some teenagers who can't go a day without taking a big risk. (I usually try to avoid these teenagers when they're behind the wheel of a car.) But I know others who tend to excel in situations that are more steady and predictable. In my youth ministry, I've got some students who run toward the high-risk opportunities, while others run away from risk as fast as they can. Which way do you run? Do you enjoy situations that are predictable and where the risks are small? Or are you an adrenaline junky who thrives off high-risk environments? It's not what you want to be, it's who you are.

*I tend to...*

1. Avoid radical changes.
2. Enjoy chaotic environments.
3. Excel when risk is very low.
4. Get motivated when I have the chance to overcome big obstacles.

### **People or Projects?**

My friend Josh loves people—all of them. I'm sure he's met a person he didn't like, but I can't find any evidence. He's

good with tasks, but he tends to be more energized by working with people instead of projects and processes that lead to projects. What about you? Do you get excited about opportunities that involve lots of direct action with other people or would you rather work behind the scenes on projects designed to make a difference?

*I tend to...*

1. Embrace opportunities to work with other people directly.
2. Look for ways to complete projects.
3. Enjoy being involved in many projects at once.
4. Find more fulfillment when I can work with someone one-on-one or in a small group.

### **Follow or Lead?**

Did you ever think about the diverse personalities among Jesus' twelve closest disciples? There was Andrew, a behind-the-scenes sort of guy, and his brother, Simon Peter, an up-front kind of guy. Maybe you enjoy following another person's lead (as long as they're leading in the right direction). Or maybe you excel when you're the one leading the group. The only one that is "right" is the one that is really you. Which may did God create you?

*I tend to...*

1. Often find myself leading others.
2. Feel comfortable when I can follow someone else.
3. Determine the direction for groups I'm part of.
4. Experience fulfillment when I help others succeed.

### **Team or Solo?**

Some people are strongest when working with a team while others are most effective when working alone. We tend to have a preference. If you feel better doing solo work, that doesn't mean you can't work with a team—it simply means you prefer working alone. What's your preference? Where are you strongest? Does being part of a team bring out the best in you? Or do you find you can have a greater impact when you're working on your own?

*I tend to...*

1. Enjoy being part of team or group.
2. Look for opportunities that allow me to work by myself.
3. Become energized by being around others.
4. Work most effectively when I'm alone.

### **Routine or Variety?**

Some people think routine is a bad work, but it really just means you prefer activities with clearly defined expectations—you're not big on being surprised. If that's how God wired you, that's great.

And it's also great if you enjoy being involved in a wide variety of projects and responsibilities and activities. So which is it?

*I tend to...*

1. Be involved in many projects at one time.
2. Prefer completing one project before starting another.
3. Enjoy being responsible for a lot of tasks at the same time.
4. Become overwhelmed with constant change.
